

MAKING UP A FAILED CREDIT

Option 1: The class may be repeated during the fall or spring semester next year. Students should contact the guidance office to make sure they are registered for the course. When a student repeats a course at CCS, the new grade will replace the former grade and will be averaged into the students' cumulative GPA.

Option 2: CCS offers a limited number of summer school classes for students who have failed a course or would like to improve a grade.

A minimum of three students is required for each class. Grades earned during the CCS summer school will be *averaged* with their semester grade, the new grade will replace the former grade and the final grade will be averaged into the cumulative GPA. Cost for CCS summer school is \$375. Fees are due by the first day of class. Email or call Mr. Davick to be added to the summer school list.

Option 3: Students may make-up courses from another accredited institution. Grace Baptist Academy and some of the North Georgia high schools offer a number of classes. Students may also make up credits through the Hamilton County Virtual School program at <http://hcschools.org/vhs/>. Any grades that are earned outside of CCS will not be averaged into the students' cumulative GPA but the failing grade will be dropped and the credit earned will go towards meeting his/her graduation requirement.
